Vice Governor Rey Andre Camacho Olegario is the second child of former Ipil Mayor and Municipal Trial Court Judge Andres Paler Olegario and Melodia Camacho, an educator. A lawyer by profession, he is known for his stint as three-term Mayor of Ipil during which he was elected President of the League of Municipalities in the province of Zamboanga Sibugay from 2001 to 2007.

As Ipil Mayor, he led its economic recovery after the destructive terrorist attack in 1994 which severely devastated the economy and undermined the peace and order of the municipality. He was a staunch supporter for the creation of the province of Zamboanga Sibugay and successfully lobbied for the establishment of the Provincial Capital in Ipil. His achievements include the establishment of the Integrated Bus Terminal (IBT) at Barangay Taway, the construction of the new Public Market at barangay Don Andres and many others.

To improve the quality of life of the Sibugaynon through effective and responsive legislation is one of the firm advocacies of Honorable Rey Andre Olegario upon his election in 2007 as the province's third Vice-Governor. Cognizant of the people's role in governance, he encouraged and pursued legislative collaboration with all sectors, private or government. He launched the Comprehensive Legislative Assistance Networking (CLAN) Program which netted good result in terms of facilitating provincial intervention to identified issues and concerns and improved legislative work rate.

Ever a legalese, he is now spearheading the formulation of the province's Revenue Code as standard for the conduct of business and revenue generation in the province. To provide for a comprehensive reference of laws and ordinances, he has actively pursued the crafting of a Code of General Ordinances.

A reluctant candidate in the 2007 Vice-Gubernatorial Elections, he has become the vanguard of good governance in the province of Zamboanga Sibugay.
